GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

This permit application form should be carefully completed in accordance with the following instructions.

Submit eleven (11) copies of the application. Applications shall be completed and submitted to the Nininger Township Clerk together with the required fee and escrow deposit.

Please provide all of the information requested on the form. Ensure that any attachments you include with the application are complete and legible. This will assist us in providing you with a prompt and informed response to your application. Incomplete applications will be rejected without action until the Application is complete and refiled.

Nininger Township operates on a fee for services basis. The application fee for Conditional Use Permit applications is set by Ordinance. Additionally, applicants are required to prepay from time to time, estimated costs to be incurred by the Township in processing applications, including planning, engineering, administrative and legal expenses. A Township representative will contact applicants regarding amount of such prepayment and any additional such prepayments from time to time. All required prepayments must be made before any action can be taken or continued on an application. In addition to the basic fee, an initial prepaid escrow amount is due at filing.

Upon receipt of the application and initial required fees, a public hearing will be scheduled before the Township Planning Commission. At the public hearing, applicants will be asked questions concerning their applications. Applicants may have a representative speak for them at the hearing.

After the Planning Commission reviews the application and holds the required public hearing, it will make a report to the Township Board of Supervisors which will promptly act on the application.

The Nininger Township Zoning Ordinance defines conditional uses as a use which generally may be appropriate or desirable in a specified zone, but which requires special approval because if not carefully located or designated, it may create special problems. Accordingly, if the Township Board approves the conditional use permit, it may impose limits, (including time limits) on the permit, as considered necessary to protect public health safety and welfare.
